Third Commandment

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it. 10 Mat 12:8 For the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath.*

11 Luke 11:28 Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it!

Fourth Commandment

Honor your father and your mother. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them.

12 Prov 23:22 Listen to your father who begot you, And do not despise your mother when she is old.

Fifth Commandment

You shall not murder. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.

13 Eph 4:32 And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God in Christ forgave you.

14 1 John 3:15 Whoever hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him.

Sixth Commandment

You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other.

15 Gen 2:24 Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh.

16 Psa 101:3 I will set nothing wicked before my eyes.

The Seventh Commandment

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income. 17 Psa 37:21 The wicked borrows and does not repay, But the righteous shows mercy and gives.

18 2 Th 3:10 If anyone will not work, neither shall he eat.

The Eighth Commandment

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

19 James 4:11 Do not speak evil of one another, brethren.

20 1 Pet 4:8 And above all things have fervent love for one another, for "love will cover a multitude of sins."

The Ninth Commandment

You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, or get it in a way which only appears right, but help and be of service to him in keeping it.

21 1 Tim 6:6 Now godliness with contentment is great gain.

The Tenth Commandment

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not entice or force away our neighbor's wife, workers, or animals, or turn them against him, but urge them to stay and do their duty.

22 Psa 37:4 Delight yourself also in the LORD, And He shall give you the desires of your heart. The Close Of The Commandments

What does God say about all these commandments? He says: "For I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me, but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments" (Exodus 20:5-6).

23 Psa 51:5 Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, And in sin my mother conceived me.

24 Mat 5:48 Therefore you shall be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect.

The Second Article (Redemption)

In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers.

On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.
