MAKERSPACE/COLLABORATIVE ROOM

Where will it be?

The MAKERSPACE/COLLABORATIVE ROOM will be on the first floor of Good Shepherd Lutheran School (“GSLS”) across from the cafeteria.

What is it?

The MAKERSPACE/COLLABORATIVE ROOM will be used for making, learning, exploring and sharing ideas/materials that uses everything from high tech to no tech tools.

Who will use it?

It will be used by Preschool 3s to 8th Graders and will be equipped with such things as TV studio, 3D printers, laser cutters, CNC machines, soldering irons, sewing machines, cardboard, legos and art supplies.

What is the benefit?

Students will have an opportunity to create something out of nothing. Learning to explore will be the core of our MAKERSPACE/COLLABORATIVE ROOM. It will help GSLS students learn critical 21st century skills in the fields of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). What will students learn?
