ALL NEW Early Childhood Center The air conditioner was lifted onto the roof by crane, several steel beams for the a/c screen have been erected, the parapet cap was installed, roof drains and overflow drains with piping were plumbed, the existing gym is being reflashed onto the new building, rough-in of electrical, plumbing, and HVAC continues along with sprinkler pipe fitting, plus interior classroom walls continue to be constructed. ### Early Childhood Center Update

Welding on the corrugated steel roof continued this week, along with preparing the section for the air conditioning unit, which is about the size of an automobile. Inside, construction of additional dividing walls with cinder blocks was begun. Rough-in plumbing, electrical and HVAC was started. We lost about one and a half days to rain. One all new classroom will be designated for learning through major muscles and movement. This Activity Room will be for lessons that require significant space or large teaching aids, such as a parachute. While preschoolers will also have access to the large gym in GSLS, if it's already occupied by grade schoolers, or the weather's unfavorable, our 2-5 year olds will have the Activity Room available at all times. Please pray for the safety of our construction crew, and for the God's blessings on our ECC program.
