ALL NEW Early Childhood Center Update -

Our Director, Julie Bedard, delivered an insightful 45-minute presentation about Early Childhood Education during Bible class this summer. Now available online, along with her PowerPoint slides, are the audio files in MP3 format which you can listen to with your computer or mobile device. The Climbing Wall in our Activity Room is finished! GSLC member Arny Friend, with the assistance of his wife, Bev, installed the Climbing Wall and the numerous handholds and footholds. Instead of traversing up our Climbing Wall, the children's goal is to move laterally across the wall at an appropriate height, with safety mats on the floor beneath them. Outside, work continues on the Fall Zone, the space below the swings and climbing structure. The timbers are drilled and positioned with rebar. Next Bryan Whitehead's team will install weed-blocking fabric, gravel and mulch. Early Childhood Center Update

The swings and climbing structure were installed in the Outdoor Classroom this past week. The climbing structure is made from green and brown recycled plastic lumber and features two slides, a climbing chain, a short bridge, lily-pad-style steps, and a climbing chute. The framework for the pizza garden, made from the same lumber, was built and positioned at the center of the surrounding sidewalk. Dirt for the three-foot-tall berm was delivered, and holes were dug for several new trees. School students in the Challengers classes (grades 2-8) are ready to build indoor and outdoor musical play equipment for our ECC, but they need PVC pipes and metal pipes of different lengths and thicknesses. School Counseling

Hi! I am Diana Cuddeback the counselor here at

Good Shepherd. I am a licensed clinical social worker with experience in family and individual counseling, grief counseling and counseling in schools. I will be at school on Tuesdays. If you think your child might benefit from additional support, you have concerns about your child, or you need assistance with resources in the community, con-tact me. This year we again have a grant from LESA (Lutheran Elementary School Association) that supports special character programming in your child's classroom. Look for information in your student's classroom newsletter on the topics we cover and ask your child about the activities!

Lice Volunteers Needed

Although Good Shepherd students have not experienced problems with lice nearly as often as is becoming more common, we must remain vigilant and deal with situations immediately. Lice are no respecter of cleanliness. To have lice does not mean a child or family is unclean. Parents are REQUIRED to immediately report to the school if their child is found to have lice. THIS IS NOT OPTIONAL. The school, at minimum, inspects the student, siblings, and all students in classes of affected students. STU-DENTS CANNOT RETURN TO CLASS OR ANY SCHOOL ACTIVITY UNTIL THEY ARE "NIT FREE" as determined by the school office. By working together, we can keep problems with lice to the bare minimum. Please consider making yourself available to help inspect children for lice. Each case calls for the school to inspect every class-mate, siblings, and classmates of siblings if they are found to have a case of lice. This can put an end to other school office business for the day. Training and gloves pro-vided. Contact the school office (344-3153) if you can make yourself available on an asneeded basis.
