#### 5 Ways You are Ruining Your Child's Life—Arlene Pellicane

"You're mean!" "You just don't understand!" Have you ever wondered if you are doing a terrible job as a parent? We've probably all thought that at one time or another. - 3. Feelings trump everything else. The main question these days is "How do you feel about that?" We've downplayed the power of the will to do the right thing even when your child doesn't feel like it.
- The Bible and prayer are largely ab-4. sent from everyday life. Does your child observe you reading your Bible or praying during the day.
- 5.Your marriage takes a backseat. Focus on your children first and your marriage second.
