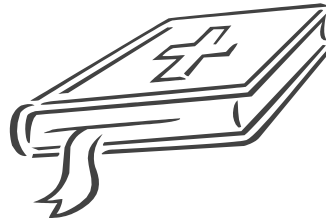

Illinois State Examination Requirements, forms and wavers are available on Illinois Department of Health (www.idph.state.il.us), the Illinois State Board of Education (www.isbe.net), Good Shepherd Lutheran (www.gslcs.org) websites.

***Physical Examination and Immunizations:**

All students entering kindergarten, 6th grade and new students entering Illinois schools for the first time will be required to have proof of a physical examination,

protection from communicable disease, performed and signed by a licensed physician. Record shall be provided on the State of Illinois Child Health Examination Form.

Students entering 6th grade are required to have two booster vaccinations called Tdap and Meningococcal.

***Dental Examinations:**

All students entering kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grade and new students entering Illinois schools for the first time will be required to have an oral health examination. The required examination must be performed by a licensed dentist and he/she shall sign the State of Illinois Dental Examination Form.

***Eye Examinations:**

All students entering kindergarten and new students entering Illinois schools for the first time are required to present proof of an eye examination by an optometrist or medical doctor who performs eye examinations and shall complete and sign the Illinois Eye Examination Report Form.

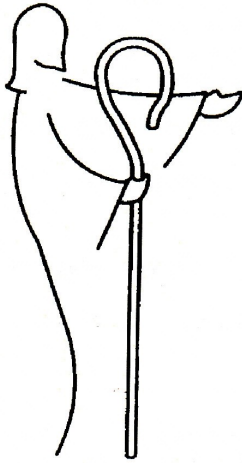

Camp sessions include daily Jesus time with a Bible story for the week as well as games, crafts and activities that reflect the Bible story theme. Our camp is staffed with Christian adult workers who have experience and/or training in working with children. Your child will receive the same quality care and education that s/he receives in our school year program.

There will be a water day every Friday and other special events relating to the theme.

Summer Fun Information

LOCATION

- 1300 Belt Line Road – Collinsville
- Preschool students and students entering Kdgn in the fall – Early Childhood Center
- Students entering Grades 1 – 8 – TRACKS area
- Both locations are accessed from the lower level parking lot that faces Belt Line

PAYMENT

- Weekly charges should be paid in full the first day your child attends in a given week. **No child will be admitted without payment.**
- Payment is by cash or check made out to Good Shepherd Lutheran School

MEALS AND SNACKS

- Morning and afternoon snacks will be provided.
- Full and Extended Day campers are to bring a sack lunch that does not require refrigeration or heating. Campers may bring their own drink or drink water.
- Extended Day campers may bring breakfast that does not require refrigeration or heating.
- **Lunches and breakfast may not contain foods that contain peanuts or tree nuts. Sun butter is a tasty alternative to peanut butter.**
- Each camper should bring a refillable water bottle that is labeled and will stay at camp throughout the week.

DRESS

- Campers should wear play clothes with respect to the school dress code: closed toed shoes with socks, shorts should extend 3 – 4" above the top of the knee, girls' bathing suits should be of one-piece design and boys' swimwear should fit appropriately.
- Your child WILL get dirty, as we have a nature-based program. Don't send any clothes or shoes that cannot get dirty.
- Preschool campers should send an extra pair of clothes in a Ziploc bag in case of spills or accidents.
- Bring a backpack or bag for take-home projects or papers.

NAP/QUIET TIME

- Full and Extended Day campers will have a quiet rest time each afternoon.
- Full and Extended Day Early Childhood Center campers should bring a **small**, light blanket (no larger than 40 x 48") and may also bring a **small** pillow and **small** stuffed animal or doll.

SUNSCREEN

- We spend as much time as we are able outside. Please apply sunscreen to your child before camp. If your child is in the Full or Extended Day program, please also send a container of sunscreen labeled with your child's name for use in the afternoon.

EXTENDED DAY

- Extended day students arriving before 7:30 a.m. will be brought to the ECC, regardless of age.
- Extended day students who are picked up after 4 p.m. will be picked up in the TRACKS area, regardless of age.
