Something to Consider...

May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ Galatians 6:14

The most widely used Christian symbol is the cross. Placed on tombstones by the devout believer, it is a bold statement of faith. In a variety of shapes, styles, and sizes, the cross is also worn from the lapel, hung from the neck, etched on rings and other jewelry. It adorns our literature and our architecture. Over the course of the centuries, the cross, both big and small, has been used in countless ways to mark God's people as those who have been redeemed by Christ the crucified.

The cross symbolizes what took place on the cross of Jesus. The heavenly Father chose to place His Son there on the first Good Friday. Christ went to the cross not because of what He had done, but for what He chose to do for us. In a love understandable only to Him, He took our place and suffered and died for our sins and for the sins of the entire world.

Nothing we can do could atone for our sin. Every attempt apart from Christ that we might try in order to deal with our sin would only perpetuate and extend our rebellion against God and His work and will. Therefore, Paul is horrified by the thought of making any boast apart from Jesus. In a beautiful statement, he declares our only hope and life, saying, "May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

STEM - FLL & FLL Jr. Informational Meeting

Parents of students who have an interest in the STEM opportunities offered at Good Shepherd (especially those currently in the FLL and FLL Jr programs) are encouraged to attend an informational meeting at the school on Wednesday, May 1 at 6 PM. The meeting will include a brief overview of the opportunities we have planned for the 2019-2020 school year. **See the attached flyer for additional information**.

1) We are excited to begin our 6th year of participation in the FIRST FLL and FLL Jr programs! FLL Jr is a non-competitive program for students in grades K-3 that introduces the idea of working together as a team as the students construct a LEGO model and presentation around the program's annual theme. It's a great way to prepare students for FLL participation.

FLL is a competitive program for grades 4-8 where teams work to create solutions for real-world problems while they also compete in various LEGO game board challenges. This year, we will be implementing some changes that will help our teams to better compete at the regional competitions while also increasing the funfactor.

2) New for the 2019-2020 school year, we plan to start a brand new program that takes a more relaxed (noncompetitive) approach to STEM-based learning. Through the use of small single-board-computers (Raspberry Pi devices), the students will learn how to get these devices running from scratch, learn how to program them to perform various tasks, and learn various mechanical engineering skills as they build components that can be controlled by the computers.

CPH Summer Reading Program





Our camp is staffed with Christian adult workers who have experience and/or training in working with children. Your child will receive the same quality care and education that s/he receives in our school year program.

There will be a water day every Friday and other special events relating to the theme.

LOCATION

- Both locations are accessed from the lower level parking lot that faces Belt Line

PAYMENT

- Weekly charges should be paid in full the first day your child attends in a given week.
 child will be admitted without payment.
- Payment is by cash or check made out to Good Shepherd Lutheran School

MEALS AND SNACKS

- Morning and afternoon snacks will be provided.
- Full and Extended Day campers are to bring a sack lunch that does not require refrigeration or heating. Campers may bring their own drink or drink water.
- Extended Day campers may bring breakfast that does not require refrigeration or heat
- Lunches and breakfast may not contain foods that contain peanuts or tree nu Sun butter is a tasty alternative to peanut butter.
- Each camper should bring a refillable water bottle that is labeled and will stay at camp throughout the week.

DRESS

- Campers should wear play clothes with respect to the school dress code: closed toed shoes with socks, shorts should extend 3 – 4" above the top of the knee, girls' bathing suits should be of one-plece design and boys' swimwear should fit appropriately.
- Your child WILL get dirty, as we have a nature-based program. Don't send any clothe shoes that cannot get dirty.
- Preschool campers should send an extra pair of clothes in a Ziploc bag in case of spills accidents.
- Bring a backpack or bag for take-home projects or papers.

NAP/QUIET TIME

- Full and Extended Day campers will have a quiet rest time each afternoon.
- Full and Extended Day Early Childhood Center campers should bring a small, light bla (no larger than 40 x 48") and may also bring a small pillow and small stuffed animal doll.

SUNSCREEN

 We spend as much time as we are able outside. Please apply sunscreen to your child before camp. If your child is in the Full or Extended Day program, please also send a container of sunscreen labeled with your child's name for use in the afternoon.

EXTENDED DAY

- Extended day students arriving before 7:30 a.m. will be brought to the ECC, regardles age.
- Extended day students who are picked up after 4 p.m. will be picked up in the TRACK: area, regardless of age.
