#### Something to Consider...

The Homeless Man

A group of high school students were assigned to do a service project at a community outreach center. The center was located in a neighborhood several miles away from their school.

When they arrived for their orientation, they encountered a homeless man asleep on the sidewalk in front of the center. The students laughed and joked about the man to one another. They commented on the poor conditions of the neighborhood and made their way inside to find that no one was there to receive them. A note on the front desk read, "Back in 5 minutes. Have a seat."

The students took seats in the waiting area. Moments later, the homeless man wandered into the center. The students began to snicker and whisper as he fixed himself a cup of coffee. But their giggles turned to gasps when the homeless man removed his shabby overcoat and hat.

With the exception of the worn sneakers, the man who stood before them was well groomed. "Welcome," he said. "I'm Mr. Jones, the director of this center."

The students, realizing that Mr. Jones had heard all of their negative comments and jokes, sank into their chairs.

"Let this be your first lesson in community service: You can't truly reach out to people if you judge them or make fun of them," admonished Mr. Jones. "Remember that a person's appearance often has little to do with his or her character. We are all human beings who will need the help of one another at some point in our lives."

May we too remember this important lesson to be learned!
