Something to Consider...

Some people have observed (tongue in cheek, of course) that for Lutherans, every day is Lent. Of course we know better. We are able to take ourselves lightly, knowing that we are new creations in Christ, who has conquered fear, death, and the devil on our behalf. The gift of laughter brings many benefits, including medical. Here are just a few:

- Laughter can lower blood pressure, increase muscle flexion and trigger endorphins the brain chemicals that can bring on euphoria.
- Laughter affects the immune system. Gamma-interferon, a disease-fighting protein, rises with laughter. So do B-cells, which produce disease-destroying antibodies, and T-cells, which orchestrate our body's immune response.
- Laughter helps shut off the flow of stress hormones, which suppress the immune system, raise blood pressure and increase the number and stickiness of platelets in our blood, which can cause fatal artery blockages.

 Donald Demaray, author of Laughter, Joy and Healing, reminds us that "Laughter and joy can alter moods and even promote physical healing. If you laugh less than 15 minutes a day, including three belly laughs, you are under laughed."

Studies have shown that the average child laughs hundreds of times a day. The average adult, only a dozen times. So, for the sake of health and hope, find that funny bone-and tickle it!

Spring Concerts and Programs

We are excited to announce plans to hold some of our annual spring concerts and programs in person this year with an adjusted format!

ALL STUDENTS are expected to attend their program. Please contact Mr. Stegman AND your child's teacher as soon as possible if your child must be absent for any reason.

Preschool-2nd Grade

Preschool-2nd grade will participate in programs by grade. Each program will be approximately 20 minutes long. The Preschool-2nd grade programs will be held in the front parking lot with the students performing from the sidewalk near the school main entrance. Families may park in the front parking lot and bring lawn chairs to sit and listen to the program. Families will be responsible for making sure their seats are reasonably distanced from other families. Because this is an outdoor event where more than adequate distancing is possible, face coverings will be optional for audience members. Students should arrive with a face covering in place but may be allowed to remove them during the actual program if their class numbers allow for adequate distancing in the performance area. (If you prefer that your child does not remove his or her face covering even when well distanced, please discuss that with your child as it will be their responsibility to keep it in place. You may also notify your child's teacher and Mr. Stegman but it will ultimately be the child's responsibility.)

PLEASE arrive no earlier than 15 minutes prior to your child's program and leave promptly after your child's program so that the lot is clear for the next class! The preschool-2nd grade programs will be held on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>May 2nd</u>, <u>2021</u>. If the programs are not possible due to rain, the rain date will be Sunday, May 16th, 2021 at the originally scheduled times.

Students may wear nice dress clothes of any color, school standardized dress, or school year theme t-shirts with dress pants or standardized dress pants/shorts/skirts/jumpers. Please do not wear denim or t-shirts other than the school year theme t-shirts.

5th-8th Grade

5th-8th grade will present a concert with singing from the combined classes and a performance by the 5th-8th grade band members on the LOWER parking lot near the tracks door. Family members should bring a lawn chair to sit and listen to the program. Families will be responsible for making sure their seats are reasonably distanced from other families. Because this is an outdoor event where more than adequate distancing is possible, face coverings will be optional for audience members. Students should arrive with a face covering in place but may be allowed to remove them during the actual program when they are distanced in the performance area. Band members will be distanced from one another as they must remove face coverings to play instruments. The 5th-8th grade concert will take place on Tuesday, May 4th, 2021 at 6:30 PM. If the concert is not possible due to rain, the rain date will be Thursday, May 6th, 2021 at 6:30 PM.

Students may wear nice dress clothes of any color, school standardized dress, or school year theme t-shirts with dress pants or standardized dress pants/shorts/skirts/jumpers. Please do not wear denim or t-shirts other than the school year theme t-shirts. **ALL STUDENTS are expected to attend their program.** Please contact Mr. Stegman AND your child's teacher as soon as possible if your child must be absent for any reason.

LESA Virtual Auction


