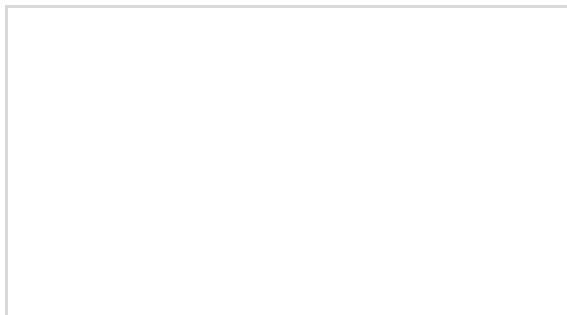
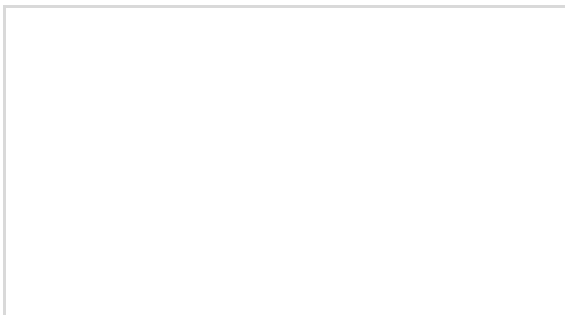


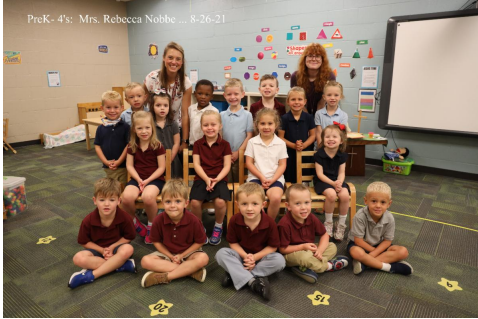

Our teachers encourage questions.

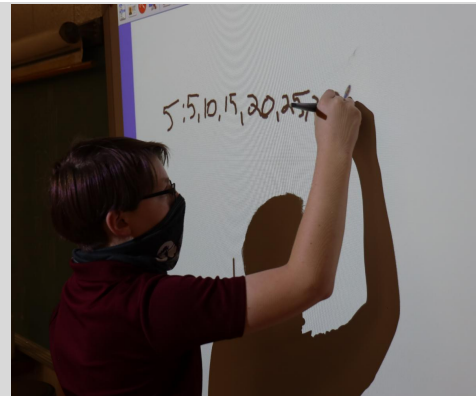

For our first Staff Spotlight, I thought we'd start with the man who makes this school fun, impactful and run smoothly--Mr. Bob Mayhew!! He started at Good Shepherd on July 1, 1984, and worked with the first 8th grade class to pick the school colors.

He had many responsibilities that first year; he was a teacher for 4th

"It's a Great Day to be a Charger" and

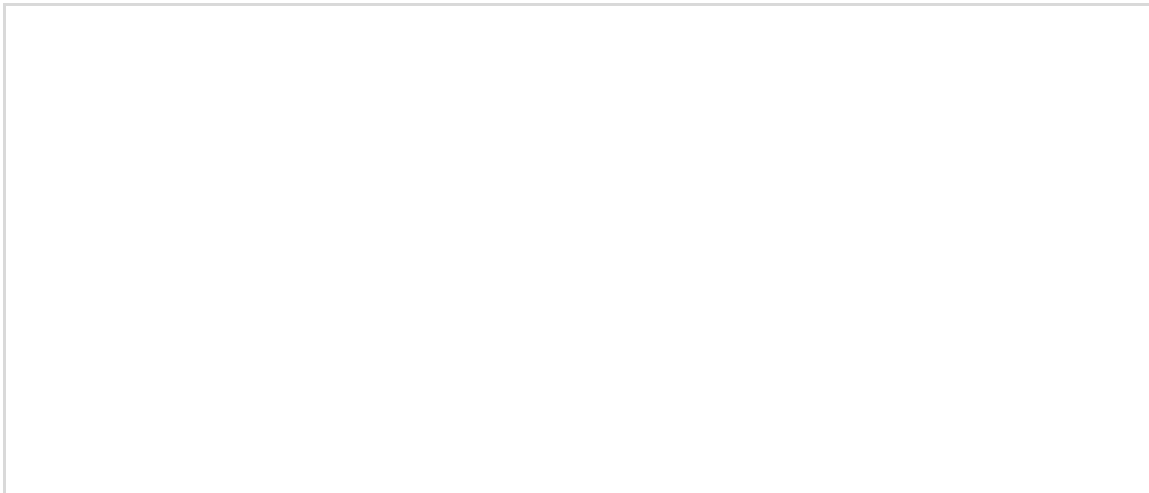
"What can you do with God's help to make this day special for everyone?"

"Being part of that first 8th grade class, there were so many new things to consider. Making the move to Good Shepherd after being at Holy Cross for eight years (K-7) was a big change and still exciting. We had Mr. Cochran as a teacher at Holy Cross, and of course he was our teacher and principal at Good Shepherd. My mom had also taught kindergarten at Good Shepherd for a number of years so that made the transition easier. Mr. Cochran, Mr. Mayhew and others had to be creative in how they managed things since we started all eight grades at the same time.

"My most memorable moment was the class trip to Chicago-- it was awesome! Being in the portable classroom during a significant hail storm was memorable, and Confirmation was a highlight.

"Being at Good Shepherd for 8th grade was a great opportunity to strengthen my academic life and leadership skills. We had the opportunity to take the lead of this new endeavor in many ways. Learning from Mr. Cochran was intense, yet very rewarding. Heading to Metro East Lutheran High School after being at Good Shepherd was easy and a natural flow in my Lutheran education. Mr. Cochran, Pastor Kastens, and others were incredible role models of faith. They set the standard high for Biblical knowledge and understanding, and were motivating through confirmation and my daily life.

"I attended Concordia University Wisconsin and earned my BA in Secondary Education and Music in 1993 and then my MA in Educational Administration. I currently am the Dean of Programs and Facilities at Rockford Lutheran School in Rockford, IL, and I love how God uses me to impact students. I get to give back in the same way that Mr. Cochran, Mr. Mayhew, Pastor Kastens and others gave to me at GSLS.



"I have been married to Jenny for 28 years. We have two children: Samantha who is 16 and Bohdan who is 13, and we enjoy taking trips together. I am thankful to my parents for providing me with the opportunity to go to Lutheran schools for my entire educational journey. Good Shepherd was a highlight in that journey, equipping me with skills and relationships that led to future success in education and beyond."
