Our girls volleyball team is coached by Matt Parker and Graig Peterson. They play great together and are having a super season!!!










#### Girls and Boys Cross Country






#### You should then see GSLS.

Mrs. Melissa Hasamear graduated from SIUE in 2003 with a Bachelors of Science in Education, and later completed the Colloquy Program through Concordia University Chicago.

She has been teaching for 19 years, and this is her 9th year at GSLS. She is our 7<sup>th</sup> grade homeroom teacher and teaches English to 6<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> graders, and guides the journalism class. She enjoys teaching at GSLS because she has the opportunity to teach a very rigorous curriculum that challenges students and helps them develop and master skills they never believed they were capable of mastering. She LOVES seeing the progress these students achieve during their middle school years.

An absolute favorite time for her is when these students come back to visit after graduating from GSLS and share how prepared they were for high school as result of the education they received here.



Keith Rincker earned his Bachelors of Science in Education degree from Concordia Teachers College, and receive his Masters of Science in Education from Southern Illinois University. He has been a teacher for 40 years, with 32 of those being here at GSLS. He is our 8th grade homeroom teacher and teaches Science and Art to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders, Reading to 6th and 8th graders, and Algebra, PE, and Health to 8th graders.

What he loves most about teaching here is the joy of seeing the children come to school and enter the room with a smile, which makes his problems seem very small. He also enjoys seeing students from past years come back to visit their former teachers. Occasionally, he will still see many former students at school functions and in the community.



She shares that she teaches at GSLS because she has the privilege of sharing her faith with her students. There is not a day that goes by that she doesn't recognize how blessed she is to teach here. She begins each day by sharing God's Word with her students, as they read a devotion together and then spend time praying. Additionally, there are opportunities during the week to worship in chapel and serve the community together. Her students get to see daily that loving Jesus isn't just going to church on Sunday--it's a way of life.

Most recently, her class is working on a project to create care packages for the Afghan refugee children who have been brought to our country and have nothing.

Here are his memories of being at GSLS:

"Leaving Holy Cross my 8th Grade year to attend Good Shepherd meant leaving behind several friends and the security of a familiar place. I was in a portable trailer classroom with three grades and one teacher. It was new, different, and stressful. One of my most memorable moments was being in the trailer when we had a storm producing golf ball-sized hail. Giant hail on a metal roof makes a whole lot of noise!

I believe adjusting to the changes of attending Good Shepherd helped prepare me for navigating the high school experience at Metro East Lutheran High School. Holy Cross and Good Shepherd both provided a good education and prepared me well for high school. That's saying a lot, as some of my freshman

classes at Concordia Seward were easy, compared to attending Metro East Lutheran High School. Being daily in the Word in the classroom gave me the peace and strength of Christ throughout my education. It taught me to seek my fulfilment in God, which is the only way to find contentment in this life and the next!
