
Chapel is a very important part of our week. Our students have the opportunity to worship God, pray, and learn from God's Word.

I have been enjoying my time here as the 65L5 Development Director—seeing all the GREA' things God is doing through this school! The teachers and staff members are an anazing, hard-working group of Christians, and the students are simply FANTABULOUS! 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Good Shepherd has a rich history, led by the hond of God. It was established on August 27, 1984 for the community and our Good Shepherd Church family. We had a small building and two pertable units to accommodate students hat year. In 1987, we had our second building project to add more classrooms, a science lab, hirthen, and gymnasium. That year, we were blessed with 245 students! Our first principal was Mr. Bill Gochran, and he was fartiful to lead this school until he was called to another position in 1992. Mr. Pall Brandt continued to lead the school until he took another call in 2000. Our current principal, Mr. Bob Moyhew, was the first male teacher hired back in 1984, and he become our principal in 2000. He is the only regional staff member still on board here and does a wonderful job leading our students and staff. Now 33 years later, we have 31st authorst, hove graduated hundreds of 8° graders who have gone on to do VERY well in high school and college, and are blessed with a dynamic and dedicated staff!






## Charger Bucks - Scrip

Students are only accepted based on their audition, which is blindly evaluated by professional instrumentalists. The students will travel to the University of Illinois to practice in the historic Harding Band Building with Barry Houser (director of the Marching Illini), tour the John Philip Sousa Museum and Archives, and perform a concert in the world class Krannert Center for the Performing Arts.
