Chapel Offerings

Thank you for remembering chapel offerings. During August through October the offerings amounted to \$837.46 which helps reduce the loan and supports our Early Childhood Center. In November, the students' offerings will go to the Garuna Foundation which has established a system of Christian tutoring

schools in Cambodia. At present seven schools serve more than 1,200 students in grades K-6. The goal of the schools are to provide a daily, year-round opportunity for children to learn about Jesus, while also studying Khmer (Cambodian) reading/writing, Math, and basic English. These schools are in communities where only 2% of the population are Christians and most have little or no knowledge of Jesus. Thank you for helping this ministry.

Family Matters

Until recently, our nation's cultural ethic defined our personal values. Today however, we live in an age of moral diversity, a post-modern society that says there is no right or wrong. While some people view this as a positive development, others wonder how to teach their children right from wrong when everyone has a different set of values.

The vast difference in values has created problems throughout our society as children struggle with the conflicting messages they receive.

Finding moral common ground, however, is not as difficult as it appears. Most parents want to instill values as honesty, gentleness, empathy, compassion, kindness, respect, honor, and self-control. But how do parents raise moral children in an amoral world?

Gary Ezzo, pastor and author of Growing Kids God's Way parent training program, and Robert Buckmaan, M.D. believe they have a plan that works. In their book On Becoming Childwise, they say that more emphasis should be placed on moral training, above physical skills, intellect and emotional development.

They believe that when moral training is put first, the other areas important for the all-around developmental of children fall into place.

The authors have established 15 Childwise principles that foster safe, secure growth of children's self-concept and world view. All of the principles flow from the First Principle, which teaches children to do unto others what they would have others do to them—commonly know as the Golden Rule.

The First Principle is the most important one because it teaches children to build and maintain healthy relationships. If children can learn early on to develop strong relationships with others, they are less likely to fall prey to problems later on, especially in their teens.

Asking "Would you like someone to treat you the way you just treated Jennifer?" may seem simplistic, but it is a good way for children to learn that others count.

Moral training sows seeds for a rich harvest in the teen years. Remember to stay close to God and ask for guidance as you train, guide and share with your children the importance of living their lives by the principle of, what would Jesus do?

Help Your Child Understand Why Interruptions Are Not Welcome

The more a child understands how their behavior affects others in a negative way, the more the child will naturally make the right choice. Kids have a natural desire to be liked and loved. Emphasize that refraining from interrupting is a kind of power your child has, and offer praise when he or she exhibits that restraint.
