From Our Counselor

As a parent, you have likely witnessed emotional dysregulation. We may witness our child hitting, kicking, screaming, crying, holding their breath, etc. Emotional dysregulation can be similar in adolescents, but may be expressed differently. Usually there is no build-up that leads to emotional dysregulation. The car goes 0-60 in 2 seconds flat. Emotional regulation is not a skill that we are born with. Instead, it is a skill that we must practice and as children, it is important to have this skill modeled for us in as many areas of our lives as possible. The prefrontal cortex is the part of our brain responsible for focus/attention, predicting consequences of actions, coordinating/adjusting complex behaviors (I can't do a before b), impulse control/managing emotional reactions, and anticipating events that happen in the environment. The prefrontal cortex plays a big part in emotional regulation, so understanding that this part of the brain is not fully developed until 25 years of age, helps reframe negative thoughts many have developed about children experiencing emotional dysregulation. Just remember there are no kid-sized emotions. The same emotions that we experience as adults are the same emotions that our kids experience. Think of a time where you experienced intense anger/frustration. Think back to the way your body and mind experienced that emotion. Now imagine that same feeling being inside the body of a

5-year old. It's a lot to handle!

What can we do to help our kids through these more intense emotions? Deep breathing is a great way to help. There are so many fun ways to each kids deep breathing from volcano breathing to cowabunga breathing techniques. Physical activity is another way to help reset the brain during emotional dysregulation. Jumping jacks or going for a quick run can help the brain snap back into action. For children who don't like to be touched or need space to calm down, creating a calm-down corner in your home can be beneficial. This is a safe place, usually filled with soft items and coping skills/options that a child can use to help deescalate. Once the child is calm, parents can enter the space and reflect on what happened. Name the emotion and make sure you explore ways to manage that emotion in the future. Our kids and adolescents need help naming emotions, so practicing this skill is incredibly helpful.

Finally, if you as the parent become dysregulated (hey, it happens!), remember to model healthy self-regulation. Give yourself grace because these skills take practice. Practicing these skills will increase self-awareness and emotional intelligence.


Variety Show

- Each person auditioning must turn in a permission slip signed by a parent/quardien.
