From Our Counselor

This week's Counselor's Corner topic is testing. Some kids handle tests well and don't experience any stress or anxiety. This makes testing easier and allows the child to focus, but what happens when my child experiences stress or anxiety on quiz/test day? It's very typical to feel some nervousness when it comes to taking a big test or quiz, so it's okay to normalize this for your child. Let's talk about some tips that can help your child be successful if tests make them nervous.

1. **Talk about the tests at home.** Encourage your child to do their best. Review information that may be included on the test and help them create a study routine that is balanced and focused.

2. **Give words of encouragement.** Remind your child that they have been preparing for the test. Remind them of the great job they have done studying and always let them know you're rooting for them.

3. **Make sure they get a good night's rest.** Rest is important in helping us feel our best. Make sure your child gets an appropriate amount of rest the night before any tests/quizzes.

4. **Eat a good breakfast.** If your child is full, they are able to focus more and have the energy required to do their best.

5. **Get to school on time.** Feeling rushed can create stress/anxiety prior to taking tests/quizzes. Being on time allows a child to settle in, which can aid in focus.

6. **Make sure students have everything they need.** Making sure that our kids have everything they need can help them feel more prepared. Make sure to have those pencils sharpened and any other supplies they may need.




Concordia Music Conservatory Summer Camps

- Audition forms must also be submitted to the school office, your child's teacher, or by email to Mrs. Batty or Mr. Lingel. Please complete the following information as it should appear in the program.
- All auditions must be submitted no later than Friday, March 8th.
- All acts should be presented just as they will be performed on the night of the Variety Show. If you are not prepared to perform your act as you would the night of the Variety Show, please save your act for next year.

GUIDELINES:

- There will be a 4-minute time limit for each performance. (Some performances may, by their very nature, be much shorter than a full 4-minute slot.)
- All acts must exemplify the standards of Good Shepherd Lutheran School. (This includes musical selection, lyrics, and manner of dress.)
- Each act will be required to audition. Please have sheet music, CD, <u>and</u> a copy of the lyrics. (The Internet provides sites for hard-to-find lyrics.)
- Each person auditioning must turn in a permission slip signed by a parent/guardian.

Please plan to attend the dress rehearsal on Wednesday, April 3rd, beginning at 3:30 P.M.
